But it is hoped that this will be a guide to planning the CF's programmes: the Bible expositions, the camps, seminars, training courses, and the CG programme. Some parts of the syllabus are more essential to others and remember to uphold the interdenominational character of your CF.

FES' own programmes will also cover some of these areas and the CFs can include these into their overall planning.

Guidelines how you can use this syllabus :

1. The main area under consideration is highlighted. You may want to ensure **that each or most areas are included** in your plans for the year.
2. Under each area are many individual topics you can select from. For each, a brief synopsis has been worked out. The selection of topic should be done according to your **christian Fellowship's needs**.
3. For some of these topics it may be needful to **spend more than one week** dealing with the issue. (Such topics have been indicated.) It will be wise to have the same speaker cover both talks in consecutive weeks, if possible. There are also some other topics which are **better covered at camps** and also have been indicated.
4. In another section of this Education syllabus, you will also find a **speakers' list** with their specialization and their personal contacts prepared for you. You can either select your speakers from this list or choose your own if you have any suggestions.

We hope that this preparation will be helpful in helping you effectively carry out your calling.

# **BASIC CHRISTIAN BELIEFS**

Aim:

To understand the fundamental tenets of our Christian Faith which provide an overall framework for understanding our life and the world. Understanding must also be accompanied by the appropriate response to God and how we are to live.

## **1. Who God Is**

- To understand God as the Creator and His continuing support and care for the world.
- To understand and appreciate the character of God: His Love, Holiness, Grace; His Sovereign Power, Knowledge & Wisdom.

## **2. Who We Are**

- To understand ourselves as God's creation created for relationship with Him. Man and woman are also given the responsibility of stewards of God's creation, taking care and developing it according to His purposes.
- Mankind has rebelled against God and the whole world now lives under the consequences of sin entering into life. The corruption and brokenness of life awaits the final redemption and salvation of God.

## **3. Who Jesus Is and His Work of Salvation**

- To understand Jesus as God Incarnate, that is, God come in a human person. He is both human and divine. To appreciate how God provides salvation through giving His Son in this way and how Jesus helps us in coming as a human being.
- To understand the work of Jesus in dying for our sins (the work of atonement) and making it possible for us to re-establish relationship with God and to receive His forgiveness. It is also to appreciate the fullness of the God's salvation that Jesus has made possible for mankind.

## **4. Who the Holy Spirit Is and His Work**

- To understand the work of the Holy Spirit in making effective God's salvation in our lives when we respond with repentance and faith. He gives us new life and enables us to grow in maturity into the likeness of Christ. The regeneration and sanctification work of the Holy Spirit.
- The Holy Spirit is God's presence and life in us.

## **5. What Is the Church**

- To understand that every Christian is a member of God's community. The Church's life is characterised by worship of God, submission to the teaching of scripture, unity in fellowship together, and holiness in life and conduct.
- To understand that the Church is sent into the world to fulfill God's mission. As the community of God's people we are to show by our life together the reality of God's salvation and presence in our midst. Through the real lives of Christians the world is to see the love, healing and redemption of God.

## **6. The End Times and the Second Coming of Christ**

- To understand what the Bible says about the Second Coming of Christ. What will happen at the end times when the Lord comes again. This concerns final victory over Satan, the judgement of the world, the resurrection of the body, and the nature of the New Heaven and New Earth.

# THE DEFENSE OF THE CHRISTIAN FAITH

Aims:

1. To understand the basis and reasons for the Christian Faith.
2. To provide a good defense to objections and misunderstandings of our beliefs.

## **1. The Authenticity and Reliability of the Bible.**

- To understand why Christians believe that the Bible is the Word of God. Understand the idea of the inspiration of Scripture, the nature of the Bible as the Word of God in human language.
- To understand how the books of the Bible came to be collected into the form we have today.
- What grounds do we have for the reliability of the biblical documents from ancient times down to today?

## **2. Miracles, Science and Scripture**

- What do we understand by a miracle in relation to the scientific understanding of the world?
- Have miracles been proven by science to be impossible?
- What do miracles show about God and the Christian faith?

## **3. Is Christianity Rational? Faith and Reason.**

- To understand the nature of faith and reason.
- Does believing in Christianity mean we are not rational?
- What is faith and what is reason. Does faith mean we abandon reason?
- What grounds do we have for the rationality of Christianity?

## **4. The Existence of God**

- To understand the reasons for believing in the existence of God.
- What are some reasons people do not believe in God?
- How can we "prove" God's existence and what do we mean by proving His existence?

## **5. God as Trinity**

- To understand the Christian teaching about the Trinity – God as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. God as One yet in Three Persons, not three gods.
- Why is it important to hold that Jesus Christ and the Holy Spirit are co-equal with God the Father?
- What are some objections and misunderstandings about this teaching on the Trinity and how can we answer them?



## **6. The Deity of Christ**

- To understand the teaching about the divine nature of Jesus Christ.
- To consider the objections given against the deity of Christ and how to answer them
- To understand the importance of this doctrine for Christian faith.

## **7. The Resurrection of Christ**

- To understand the significance of Christ's resurrection for the Christian faith.
- To know the biblical evidence for our belief in the empty tomb and Christ's resurrection.
- To answer the objections given for the fact of the bodily resurrection of Jesus Christ.

## **8. The Question of Suffering and Evil**

- Why is there evil and suffering in the world?
- How can God be good and powerful when there is so much suffering?
- Does Christianity have an answer and way out to the problem of suffering?

## **9. Do All Religions Lead to God?**

- To understand the differences and similarities between religions.
- Why do some people say all religions are different routes to the same goal? How do we answer such views?
- How is Christ unique and in what way is he different from all the other religious figures and founders of religions? What are the reasons for claiming that Jesus is the only way?

## **10. Is Christian Experience Valid?**

- To understand the nature and basis of Christian experience.
- To answer the objection that Christian experience is only a subjective feeling, similar to other religious experience, and is just a human experience without any objective basis.

## **11. Relativism and Truth**

- To understand the contemporary claim that there is no universal objective truth but only "truth" as held by an individual or by a group ("What I hold to be true is truth for me"). To consider the weaknesses of this claim and to know the reasons for holding that truth is objective and universal.
- Are moral values and lifestyles merely relative and according to personal tastes and preferences? Is there an ultimate basis for moral behaviour and a right lifestyle?

## **12. Cults and their Beliefs**

- To know the important characteristics and teachings of cults and how they are different from the Christian Faith. To help us recognize the signs and characteristics of groups which may be cultic.
- Some important cults to know: Jehovah Witnesses, Mormonism, Unification Church ("Moonies"). How do we handle members of cults and answer them when they approach us? How do we equip ourselves to resist cults?

## **13. Occults and their Practices**

- To understand and beware of the nature of occultic practices and the beliefs which lie behind them. To learn to discern and identify the unchristian and ungodly ideas related to occultic groups and practices. To know how to recognize the signs of occultic involvement and beliefs.

To know how to arm ourselves against such groups and how to deal with people who are involved in these groups and practices.



# A SURVEY OF THE BIBLE OR BOOK STUDY-EXPOSITION

Aims :

1. To highlight major themes of the various books in the Old and New Testament. To impart major contents, highlight themes in each section and to look at the theological contribution of each section.
2. To aid appreciation and understanding of the different biblical genre/literature in their historical and cultural background.
3. To learn practical truths from the bible text.

To trace the history of the Old Testament, through the different events and periods

# THE CHRISTIAN LIFE

Aims :

1. To have a deeper understanding of what it means to live out the Christian life under God.
2. To understand the processes and means of deepening our relationship with God.
3. To understand and grow in true spirituality.

## LIFE WITH GOD

To cultivate the inner life of the Christian

### 1. Intimacy with God

- Exploring how we can develop an intimate relationship with God. Looking into the areas of **Confession, Consecration, and Conversion**, by being transparent with God. Learning to be in tune with His Word and His voice.

### 2. Worship

- Deepening our understanding of personal and corporate worship. Setting apart times for worship, and looking at how we can use that time. Worshipping not only with our voice and talents, but also with our whole lives.

### 3. Prayer

- Understanding prayer - that it encompasses both our response to God, and also our responsibility toward our world (intercession). Learning how we can grow in relating with God in this way.

### 4. Meditation

- Seeing meditation as a way of listening to God, and understanding how we can learn to meditate on His Word, His impressions, His World.



## LIFE IN THE CHURCH

To strengthen and grow the corporate life of all Christians.

To understand our place in relation to the church.

To appreciate and understand the traditions / rituals of our church.

### 1. Body Life / Fellowship

- Understanding the importance of fellowship and of the Body of Christ. Seeing how we can develop quality fellowship through the giving of ourselves.

### 2. Serving / Using Our Gifts ( 2 sessions)

- Identifying our own gifts and seeing them in the context of serving Christ's Body.
- Seeing service as a way of giving of ourselves, and eventually as a way of living.

### 3. Giving to God & Tithing

- Understanding that our possessions and money is given to us on trust, by God.
- Understanding our role as **stewards** of our money, and giving back to God what belongs to Him. Looking at tithes as commanded by God - in a way that is not legalistic, but rather in a way of offering our best to God.

### 4. The Sacraments

- The church as Body celebrates many sacraments and memorials unto the Lord. What is their place in the Body of Christ? Understanding the significance of the Lord's Supper, Baptism, others and its **challenge** and **hope** to the church of God.

# LIFE IN THE WORLD

## A. MISSION

To create mission-mindedness - instilling a sense of calling, the fact that we are being **sent** as *children of God* to be in a certain place and a certain time.

### 1. Mission Possible (1 session)

- To give biblical and a historical understanding of what Christian mission is. This includes a knowing of whose responsibility it is, where the mission field is and where does mission begins.
- To create awareness and provide understanding that we are missionaries wherever we are, looking specifically in the student context (college and university, at home and abroad). Student life is more than just a paper pursuit, also to look into the **calling** of a Christian student and **how** one would work out that calling in the student context.

### 2. Mission Awareness

(1 session - to be held on a regular basis, and instilled as part of the whole CF's programme)

- To introduce world-wide mission needs, focussing on people groups, countries, mission agencies i.e. OMF, OM, InterCare, YWAM etc.
- To have an awareness of world-wide mission needs through to personal testimonies of different missionaries and how God works in their own lives as well as the lives of the people in their mission field.
- As a result, are encouraged to provide avenues and opportunity to regularly provide support financially or through prayer - for mission needs and unreached people groups i.e. 10/40 Window, Operation World, IFES Praise & Prayer Letter
- Also, to be challenged as would-be graduates and professionals into full-time ministries or tent-making careers.

## **B. SOCIAL CONCERN**

The responsibilities of the Church towards the people in the world are basically 3-fold

- to evangelise
- to build up the body of Christ (discipleship) and
- to do good (social welfare/action).

Much has been spoken of and written about Evangelism and Discipleship, but "doing good" has been considerably less prolific. Having a session(s) on this would redress this infortunate imbalance.

(1 session - held on a regular basis)

### **1. To understand what "social concern" is**

- (Seeing another on eye-to-eye level and not looking down upon the needy.) To create awareness of the necessity for social concern and social action. This is through the correct understanding of God's command , that we are commanded to care.

### **2. Learning about the God who cares**

- The cross and its implications to our caring, the attitude and ministry of Jesus, and what our response should be - a giving as well as a receiving in an attitude of humility.

### **3. To have awareness of the different ministries and areas of caring**

- Social concern, focusing on certain groups i.e. Malaysian CARE, Church groups, Shelter etc. and how the CFs can be involved in this area of social concern - prayer support, volunteer work, finance.



# RELATING TO SELF & OTHERS

## A. KNOWING SELF

To understand the meaning of persons, as created by God, including our sexuality. The cultivation of a healthy self-esteem and acceptance of who we are. Includes personal integration of mind, emotions, will; and of our past, present and future. To examine our personalities, bodies, talents and gifts; encouraging us to recognize God's sovereignty and our own distinctiveness

### 1. Relating to Myself (1 session)

- To help Christians discover afresh the biblical perspective and basis of who they are and self-acceptance
- To understand the factors which have moulded my personality and temperament
- To understand that change is a slow process but Christ through His Holy Spirit bears with us, nurturing us and guiding us

### 2. Temperament / Working Style (1 session: advisable syllabus for camps/retreats)

- To help Christians discover and understand their own temperament or working styles (i.e. DISC, Tim La Haye's 4 Temperaments)
- And how they can use their strengths, work on their weaknesses and learn to accept others in the process of it all, learning to use their own temperament/styles to flex to others

### 3. Spiritual Gifts (1 session: advisable syllabus for camps/retreats)

- To help Christians discover their possible spiritual gifts,
- Looking at their gifts from a biblical perspective and how it is used for the Body, also gifts that need to be nurtured, developed and used in obedience and humility

### 4. Sexuality (1 session - can be combined with "Relating to the Opposite Sex)

- To enable Christians to have a healthy self image pertaining to their sexuality and bodies, based on how God has created us and his purpose for us as sexual beings
- To help students identify and understand that distorted images (needs to be traced back to its source) leads to confused sexuality and distorted sexuality... resulting in unhealthy sexual practices and indulgence

## **B. RELATIONSHIPS**

To understand the biblical teaching of creation of man as a relational being, and that God places him/her in the context of institutions of relationships.

### **1. Relating to Parents/Family** (2 sessions : advisable syllabus for a camp)

- To understand that God uses all the mistakes, abuses and poor judgements that befell us in our family stories to shape us into the characters he wants us to be; and knowing the story He wants to write on our lives is critical
- To recognize the way our particular family story developed is instrumental in shaping who we are today, our responses, the way we act, think and feel
- To discern places in our family stories that need rewriting... conforming our stories to God's unique story for us
- To understand our role as Christians to our family members
- Understanding our family members

### **2. Cultivating Soul Friendships** (1 session)

- To encourage developing of strong friendships out of which we can grow more deeply in our Christian life and ministry
- To develop mutual accountability in our walk with God
- To caution against "dangerous waters" and friendships which becomes unhealthy, stifling, or destructive to our walk with God
- To learn how to be real (authentic!), how to accept and how to love one another the way Jesus does
- To understand the role, meaning and importance of forgiveness

### **3. Relating to the Opposite Sex** (1 session)

- To teach and give an understanding of the beauty that lies in the difference of the creation of man and woman
- To encourage cultivating healthy friendships with the opposite sex
- To encourage an attitude of learning to respect and accept each other as man and woman
- To be free to express yourself not according to the traditional ideas or stereotypes, but to be open minded and at the same time to understand certain boundaries

**4. Singleness** (1 session - preferably in addition to "Love, Courtship & Marriage")

- To help Christian gain a wholesome and healthy understanding of singleness
- To come to terms with some fears and coping with loneliness

**5. Love, Courtship & Marriage** (1 session)

- To lay a biblical foundation on the meaning and understanding of marriage and sex as God intended it to be
- To give biblical guidelines in choosing a life-partner and courtship - passion and purity!
- To understand what it really means to "love" (also a practical sense) and how to proceed on to mature love in a relationship
- Finding an identity and worth of self aside from your partner, in a relationship and learning to face stumbling blocks



## HANDLING TRANSITIONS

### 1. Facing **CHANGES** (1 session - college/final year students)

- To understand that life is a series of hellos and goodbyes - transitions; and how each transition will have it's own effect on our lives
- Learning how to cope with the challenges and changes that come with each transition
- Seeing that each transition is part of God's plan for us - how we can grow and mature from it
- Learning how to make adult decisions - based on what a decision entails, nurturing a discerning mind and spirit, how our decisions affect our lives as well as others, allowing God to enter into the picture, being responsible persons

Aims :

1. To help Christians think critically about basic issues of life in the world and especially issues faced by Christians in Malaysia.
2. To help Christian work out a basic biblical response to such issues.
3. To help Christians appreciate the broader dimensions of Christianity.

## TOPICS

(italics indicate priority)

### 1. **Sex and Sexual Issues**

- *the sanctity of sex within marriage, dangers and consequences of pre-marital sex*
- *distorted images of sex, sexual sins and sexual purity*
- *biblical view of homosexuality, dealing with and responding to people with this tendency*

### 2. **Abortion and Euthanasia**

- the giver of life : God or Man?
- when is it permissible, what are the considerations, or is it not permissible at all?

### 3. **Wholesome attitude towards leisure**

- *the importance of leisure to the overall person*
- *grey areas for Christian's leisure*
- *how to make use of our leisure time constructively to help us rest and relax*  
*eg. gambling, disco dancing, pubs and drinking alcohol, martial arts*

### 4. **The Influence of Media, Music and Entertainment**

- knowing the "objective" of people in the business
- identifying and countering hidden messages

### 5. **Coming Home after Graduation**

- *how to prepare to come home after studying abroad :*
- *settling back with the family, home church, finding a job etc...*
- *my home and homeland : my mission & loyalty*

### 6. **Freedom of Religion in Malaysia**

- *our rights as stated in the constitution*
- *what are some restrictions to be aware of*
- *how to handle difficult situations*

## **7. Christian and Race Relations**

- *loving without prejudice*
- *how to relate cross-culturally*

## **8. The Christian And The State**

- the role of Christians in nation-building
- Christians in politics

## **9. The Christian and the Environment**

- *why Christians should care*
- *how we can play a role*

## **10. The Christian and the Stockmarket**

- *why and why not a Christian should be involved*
- *what are the stakes and principles involved*

## **11. Christianity and The Arts (music, theatre, dance and the like)**

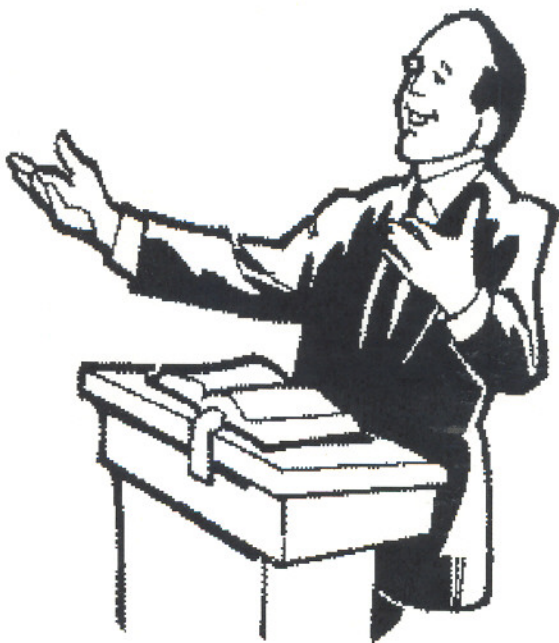
- Stewardship of creativity as a God given ability
